Principal's Message

Welcome

A big welcome to Term 3 and a new semester of learning. I hope that you all had a fantastic holiday break and had a chance to spend some quality time with your parents. We started Term 3 last week with a great school development day focussed around some specific targets to make adjustments to the way in which we program. This weekly programming is focussed on learning outcome mapped learning activities with embedded formative assessment. This is part of a 5-week learning sprint that will allow teachers to develop their capability in this area with the Assistant Principal's leading reflection in their respective K-2 and 3-6 meetings. We will be evaluating this in a twilight professional learning session in the middle of the term and using this evaluation to flow into the next process cycle.

School Planning

This semester also brings us to the end of the current school planning cycle. For the past three years, the school has been working towards improvement in three different strategic directions of Teaching and Learning; Leadership; and Culture. A new four-year school planning cycle commences this semester with the development of a new School Improvement Plan know and the SiP.



This process starts with the school developing a Situational Analysis that will adopt a process of looking inwards at what our data, feedback and own professional judgment; outward at the system priorities and research and forward at how we can shed inefficient and unpurposeful processes, adapt and improve others and innovate with new practices. This is an internal but inclusive document but it will lead to external consultation as part of the later stages of the School Improvement Plan. We will certainly keep you up to date with developments.

Wellbeing

At our school development day we also focussed on wellbeing with a session led by the Wellbeing Team aimed at developing a greater integration between the Positive Behaviour for Learning; expectations, teacher students interactions, and the Leader In Me seven habits. We have been moving forward with our antibullying priorities with the commencement of executive duties in the second half of lunchtime, proactive supervision of key student groups. We have also started planning for the Upstanders Leader in Me team through the explicit teaching of what a bystander is and how that differs from an upstander. We believe that Ms Waring is also now tasked with developing some greater opportunities at break times related to science, technology, engineering and mathematics STEM and the PB for L team is looking at additional equipment that can be brought in safely into the playground environment. As part of Education Week, our Fathering Project relaunch happens with an online session by John Kirkland. All are invited to the session. We strongly recommend all fathers join us in this as we know that a father's positive involvement in a child's schooling is very important. There is a short article detailing how to access the meeting later in this newsletter.

Education Week

Term 3 usually starts with schools across NSW celebrating through Education Week. This includes open days, special events. It is particularly sad that this year we are unable to have parents, carers, grandparents and other significant carers and relatives come into the school and visit children in classrooms. This is especially true when one considers the fact that this years theme is 'Learning Together.' The staff have, though, thought very carefully about how we might be able to make up for this and have developed a program of classroom and event visits which through the week we will be broadcasting live. The details of this are included as a separate article and we hope that you will be able to join in and use this as an opportunity to join in.

Minor Revisions to Wet Weather Drop Off

To better manage our resources, we are asking that all entrants from years 4 to 6 please go to the Ewos Parade office entry gate. The gate into the southern site will be closed. The Trevellyan Street gate into the northern site will be open.

This will allow us to do our usual temperature checks and hand sanitising at two points and will be the case going forward during wet weather drop off.
