Principal's Message

With week 3 upon us it seems amazing that due to the first week being one day at school, the students have only been on site for 9 days. In that time we have finally formed our classes for 2021 having met the NSW Department of Education's requirement to allow us to form 11 classes. We communicated this earlier to parents in a SchoolZine email and SZapp but it is repeated in this newsletter.

As we get started with classes, Mrs Waring, Ms Pryor and the teachers are keen to provide some information to you in a Meet the Teacher fashion. Again this information was communicated via SchoolZine email and SZapp so that you may RSVP for your spot via the survey. We will also be making videos available to you that go through how the stage and classes are set up.

I attended the Stage 3 camp last week and thanks to the great organisation starting with Ms Chapman last year and Mrs Waring this year, we had an amazing time at the Kincunber Great Aussie Bush Camp. The students who attended were brilliant and it was amazing watching them take risks with the activities. Some activities focussed on trust, hesitation and focus and included walking off a ledge at 15m in an activity called the Power Fan and being released in a giant swing with two other students at up to 20m.

The focus on safety was also great for the students as they were able to see how using the correct safety equipment enabled them to be safe while taking risks. I certainly thoroughly enjoyed myself and I know that Mrs Waring and Ms Galletta would echo my words. I would also like to thank both of them for the huge commitment in energy to make this happen as well as Ms Chapman for all the organisation last year that allowed it to happen so soon in the school year.

Our new Kindergarten students started last week and after only three days we were able to form classes. Ms Buhagiar, Ms McIntosh and Ms Palmervale have been working very hard to make this the very best start with great support from all around them. Thank you to them for their commitment. Indeed the start of the year is challenging for all teachers as they organise their new classes and I would like to thank them for the professionality and effort.

I hope the next two weeks are enjoyable for you.

Meet the Teacher Sessions

Normally around this time of year, we hold a meet the teacher session focussed on providing all of the information that you need about their child(ren)'s new class(es). COVID-19 restrictions are still affecting the numbers we can have at the school and as such we have decided to approach this in a different way. Doing this we believe this will offer flexibility and be COVIDsafe. Our focus really is about allowing: an option for onsite; an option offsite for those who prefer; a flexible after-work time; as well as minimising the exposure time in classrooms.

Consequently, we will be:

- Providing a Face to Face opportunity to meet the teacher for up to 30 adults, including the teacher in your child's classroom. This will be held on either Wednesday 17 or Thursday 18 February at 3:45 pm to 4:05. This will be a Q & A session opportunity only. A video including information about the school, stage and class setup will be released on Monday 15 February.
- 2. A meeting via Zoom for an unlimited number of parents or relatives that will be held at 7 pm to 7:20 pm hosted by the class teacher for a question and answer session.

The purpose of this form is to RSVP for these events. In the case of the Face to Face event, attendance will be limited to 29 parents and 1 teacher. Consequently, you may only register one parent per family. You are welcome to also attend the Zoom meeting or the other parent may attend this meeting.

It will be necessary to register (RSVP) for these sessions through a simple form.

PSSA

What is PSSA?

PSSA stands for the Primary Schools Sports Association. Schools across Sydney and NSW are organised into zone groups. We are part of the Cronulla Zone group which is in turn part of the Sydney East Region. In PSSA the focus is in participation and developing great teamwork, health and fitness while having lots of fun. As a school, Cronulla South Public School participates to the maximum and this term we are doing, Basketball, AFL and 7 a side Girls Soccer.

Trials have already started yesterday and will be continuing on Friday. Coaches are our teachers who work hard to select students based on the ability they show during the trials. Students are encouraged to try out for sports but to also not be despondent if they are not selected. Sadly, we cannot take everyone, but being a smaller school a higher proportion of our students do get to go. There are two levels, juniors and seniors which depends on their age.

Some year 5's are juniors if they do not turn 11 this year and the rest who turn 11 are seniors. All of year 3 and 4 will be juniors and all of year 6 seniors. There is no doubt that sometimes, though not always, this gives year 5's an advantage over year 3's. Some schools do not allow year 3's to participate in PSSA for this reason and prefer to develop them in school. We don't do this and prefer to base it on the trial. Coaches try to be as fair as possible and this is why there are two trial dates. Selection can be a sensitive topic for some parents and we do have a selection policy that helps us out with this.

PSSA Selection Policy

If your child is not selected after trying out, we urge you to congratulate them on having a go.

Code of Behaviour

Codes of Behaviour provide a supportive framework which promotes fair play and appropriate behaviour in school sport. These codes apply to players, teachers, coaches, principals, parents, officials and spectators who together provide the environment in which school sport is played. The following Codes apply to school sport at all levels and are designed to highlight:

- the principles of enjoyment, satisfaction and safe play in sport
- that students participate for their own sake and not to fulfil the desires of parents, adult groups or peers
- the encouragement of student participation in sport and, in so doing, contribute to higher levels of health and physical fitness.

Player's Code

- Play for the fun of it.
- Play by the rules and always abide by the decisions of officials.
- Control your temper. Make no criticism either by word or gesture. Deliberately distracting or provoking

an opponent is not acceptable or permitted in any sport.

- Work equally hard for yourself and your team. Your team's performance will benefit and so will your own.
- Be willing to train and prepare for the game or competition. Preparation helps prevent injury and increases the level of enjoyment.
- Play only when you are fully fit. To play with injury will handicap your team, and may expose you to the risk of further and more serious injury.
- Be a good sport. Applaud the good play of your teammates and that of your opponents.
- At all times cooperate with your coach, teammates and opponents, for without them you do not have a competition.
- Remember the goals of the game are to have fun and improve your skills. Be modest in success and generous in defeat.

Swimming Carnival

Our Cronulla South Public School annual Swimming Carnival will take place on Monday 22 February 2021 at Caringbah Leisure Centre. All students in Years 3 to 6 will be going to the excursion. They must be able to swim competently (without stopping) for 50m, using, at the minimum, the correct freestyle technique. Thus, they will be competing in events.

A permission note detailing all of the information about this event has gone home this week. As this excursion involves water activities, the school requires that you complete the attached survey as part of the permission note. Unfortunately due to COVID restrictions parents are unable to attend this event. Guidelines clearly state that non-essential adults are still not permitted on the grounds or at school events.

Following our Cronulla South Public School Swimming Carnival, the overall winners in each event will receive a permission note inviting them to attend the Cronulla PSSA Zone Swimming Carnival to be held on Tuesday, 2nd March, 2021 at Caringbah Leisure Centre.

Frequently Asked Questions K-2

1. When do K-2 students wear sports uniforms?

Thursdays and Fridays. On Thursdays K-2 students will participate in a sports program in the hall. This term it is Gymnastics. On Fridays Kindergarten and Year 1 students will participate in sport at school. Year 2 students attend swimming lessons on Fridays.

1. Are bluetooth headphones okay?

No. Please send in 'over the ear' headphones (with the headband) that have a cord to connect to the computer or iPad. We will not be needing these for a few weeks so no rush to bring them in.

1. Is the school 'Nut Free'? Can I send a muesli bar with nuts in it to school?

We have a number of students at the school who are diagnosed to be at risk for anaphylaxis. These students have a Health Care Plan at the office. To minimise the risk of exposure for these students, we request families do not send nut products in lunchboxes. This does not include food labelled as "may contain traces of nuts". Schools cannot claim to be "nut free" but we take every precaution to keep our students who are known to be at risk from anaphylaxis safe. Part of this is our safety expectation that students do not share food.
