Stage 3 - Years 5 and 6

Literacy Numeracy

Writing Focus:

 Students will be composing their informative text on an ancient civilisation. Their writing will be used as their assessment piece and then later converted into a website.

Spelling and Grammar:

 Using knowledge of known words and base words to spell new words. For group D the focus is using their knowledge of spelling rules to correct misspelt words in sentences. Group D will focus on the morphograph i-e-v-e.

Reading Focus:

 Literacy circle groups have now rotated their topics. Students will be working on chunk 4 of their assigned texts for literacy circles. Reader's theatre will also be rehearsed and performed in class.

Numeracy Focus:

- Fractions and Decimals: finding the lowest common denominator between two or more fractions and adding and subtracting fractions with unlike denominators.
- Chance: determining and discussing the differences between the expected probabilities and the observed probabilities after both small and large numbers of trials.

2023 CSPS Tea Towel Fundraiser


